

MEETING WEDNESDAY 5-1-2024 6:00P.M.  
Municipal Bldg. 306 Byron Street McGrann

In attendance: Supervisors Southworth and Hecker, Palmer was absent, Chief Robbins and Secretary Davis

Citizens: Eddy Spence, Ricki Evans, Chad Evans, Frank Shupe, Angela Shupe, Carol Cecchi, Larry Cecchi and A.J. Panian from Leader Times.

Meeting called to order by Vice-Chairman Southworth at 6:00P.M. followed by the pledge of allegiance.

Minutes of 4/19/2024 regular meeting were distributed, motion to approve by Hecker, seconded by Southworth, no public comment heard, carried.

Open Fuel Bids:

Bradigan's Inc. .0650 above the OPIS price. Unleaded gas \$2.6446, Diesel \$2.7120 for a total of \$23,936.20.

21<sup>st</sup> Century Energy .04 above the OPIS price. Unleaded gas \$2.6403, Diesel \$2.7039 for a total of \$23,889.90,

Motion by Hecker to award fuel bid to 21<sup>st</sup> Century Energy pending review, seconded by Southworth, no public comment heard, carried.

Palmer received 3 quotes for maintenance on the generator and DS Generator was best quote. Southworth thinks it is a good idea to have a professional service it every year. Hecker made a motion to have DS Generator service the generator at the building and the 2 portable generators, seconded by Southworth, no public comment heard, carried.

Officer Lazon has made contact concerning the high grass on Ross Avenue and will be mowed next week.

Police Business:

Police report was read by Chief Robbins. Hecker made a motion to accept the report, seconded by Southworth, no public comment heard, carried. Robbins stated we have interviewed Tim Crytzer and David Glabb and both have good backgrounds. Glabb will graduate the academy in June. Southworth made a motion to hire Crytzer to start now and hire Glabb contingent on him getting his MOPETC certification in June as part-time officers, seconded by Hecker, no public comment heard, carried.

EMC Report:

Evans stated her and Rice want to thank the supervisors for sending them to the PSATS conference. They spent the entire day at the conference without power. Evans stated they saw a presentation on the township building that exploded. Rice got an email about a webinar this week for mass gathering security that they will both be taking. She hasn't received any more information on the KEMA conference. Hecker made a motion to accept the report, seconded by Southworth, no public comment heard, carried.

Fire Department Report:

Evans read there were 35 incidents in April. They helped surrounding areas with flooding because people needed help, the road crew with the light at Sheetz and people need to understand you can't pump mother nature. Southworth thanked them for the

help with the traffic signal and a downed tree. Hecker made a motion to accept the report, seconded by Southworth, no public comment heard, carried

#### Other Business:

We have applied for an ARLE grant for signal upgrades at Edgewood and Scenic. Davis stated we have received a new worker's compensation physician panel; Robbins ask if we have any input and Davis told him no. Southworth made a motion to accept the new panel, seconded by Hecker, no public comment heard, carried.

Southworth stated this is motorcycle awareness month so please don't blow grass out on the roadways and pay attention. Six Manor Township Employees ride motorcycles.

#### Comments:

Eddy Spence – would like to see ATV access on back roads. Southworth told him most of our roads end on a state road and you can't ride on state roads. Southworth told him we have investigated this before. He stated Rayburn did this in 2011. Robbins stated he rides off road also and his energy would be better served on state representatives and he would be there also. He stated Neiswonger took over Buffalo Limestone and the jake brake signs need moved up the road by Silvis Hollow and the Heilman farm.

Robbins stated he has cited 2 of the haulers and also talked to the truck inspectors. Southworth told him Silvis Hollow Road is a state road but will investigate moving the jake brake signs. He ask when Ping Wing Hollow would be resurfaced, Southworth told him EXCO has it bonded and when they are done they will be fixing the road.

Angela Shupe – ask where we are at in the pond process, Southworth told her the engineer was to start today. She stated in 1958 there was a stream that ran down where the road was built. Southworth stated we are working on the situation.

Southworth stated he feels the best solution is to go down through the field but the neighbor will no allow this to happen.

Panian – ask what the part-time terms are, Robbins told him up to 32 hours a week at \$22.25 an hour.

Cecchi – he ask when clean up was, Southworth told him it starts Monday.

Robbins – stated he received a thank-you from a DUI victim case that is going to trial and he received one from a medical call and crime victim for Rensel.

Motion to pay the bills by Hecker, and give the secretary the authority to pay any bills until the next meeting, seconded by Southworth, no public comment heard, carried.

Motion to adjourn by Hecker, seconded by Southworth, no public comment heard, carried.
